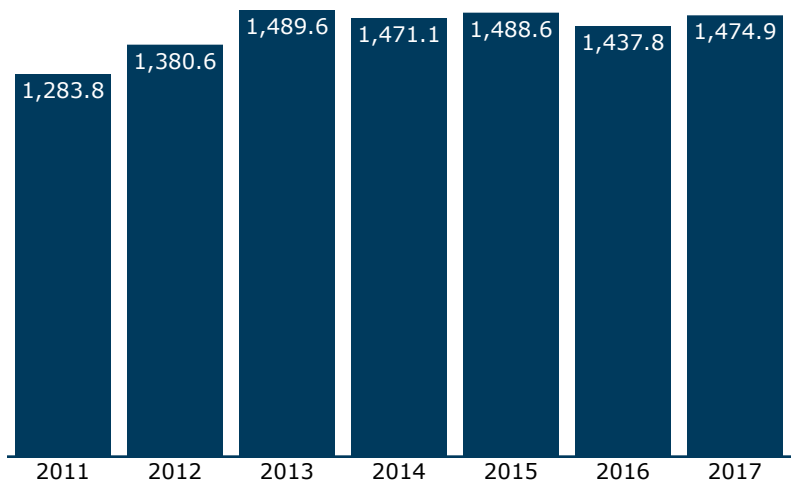


Fact sheet: Amtrak in Virginia
